Keynote Speakers and Workshops:

Clare Seccombe:

Clare was a secondary languages teacher for fourteen years, for seven of those as an AST specialising in primary languages and the international dimension. In 2009 she changed phases and now teaches Spanish and French in Sunderland primary schools as well as speaking at conferences, training teachers and trainee teachers and writing for publishers. Clare is an avid blogger and tweeter who set up and maintains Light Bulb Languages.
